in Fiji – also called Kokomo, **Lang Walker**, is throwing his support behind the bid for the United for Macarthur A-League bid.

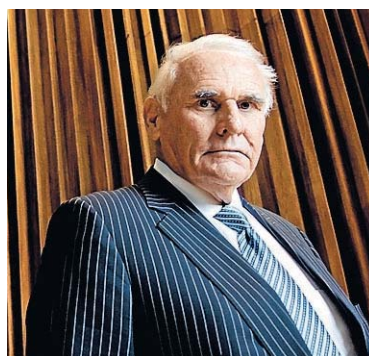
